Message from the CEO

Although 2023 presented numerous challenges, it also brought forth opportunities and accomplishments. In the early months of the year, a devastating earthquake struck Syria and southern parts of Türkiye, worsening the plight of millions of Syrians who had endured over a decade of ongoing hardship. The later months witnessed a harrowing war in Gaza, resulting in the deaths and injuries of hundreds of thousands of Palestinian civilians, including thousands of women and children. The unprecedented level of violence and destruction in Gaza requires a prolonged period of recovery and rebuilding, extending for several decades.

Driven by hope, the Asfari Foundation continued its commitment to its values and principles, steadfastly supporting civil society organisations and their diverse activities in Syria, Lebanon, Jordan, and Palestine. The foundation aims to empower youth, enabling them to seize opportunities and become active, independent contributors to building their communities and leading positive change.

As we present an overview of the Asfari Foundation's activities in 2023, we express our deep appreciation to all our partners for their dedication throughout the year and their belief in justice and the importance of the causes they commit to. You have been a source of inspiration for us all.

The foundation continued providing financial support to dozens of civil society organizations, alongside offering learning opportunities and technical support to enhance their efficiency and effectiveness. Collaborating with partners, we worked on designing innovative solutions to overcome various challenges faced by youth, particularly in refugee situations, such as education, capacity development, access to employment, and dignified living.

The focus on generating, developing, and disseminating knowledge remained one of the foundation's key programs. Collaborating with academic and research institutions, we aimed to contribute to the production and dissemination of knowledge content shedding light on development issues in our region, presenting pathways for solutions within a deeper and broader understanding of regional and global developments.

Earthquake Response

As the catastrophic 2023 earthquakes hit Syria and the southern parts of Türkiye, the Asfari Foundation supported a number of Syrian Civil Society organisations such as the White Helmets, Karam Foundation and Molham Volunteering Team, among others, to respond to the urgent needs of Syrian refugee communities affected.

In London, the Asfari Foundation supported <u>Madaniya</u> initiative, who collaborated with UK-based Syrian Civil society organisations such as <u>Action for Sama</u>, the <u>Syrian British Consortium</u>, and others to open a temporary community space in Trafalgar Square, London. The space was opened following a special event on Tuesday 14 February attended by His Majesty King Charles III and the Mayor of London, Sadiq Khan.

Civil Society and Political Acumen Program



A YEAR OF INNOVATION AND IMPACT

Through this programme, local civil society actors in Lebanon, Jordan, Syria and Palestine have learned and executed advocacy strategies, bringing voices from their communities and giving them agency in leading the development agenda. Participants will design influencing and advocacy strategies based on indepth analysis of their specific contexts, addressing various power dynamics with donors and INGOs. The Foundation would then fund the implementation of the influencing strategies. The first cohort of the programme was launched in October 2023 targeting 22 participants representing 12 civil society organisations from across the Levant region.

Supporting and Promoting Digital Transformation

In 2023, the Asfari Foundation supported 15 civil society organisations (CSOs) with Digital Transformation Grants (DTGs). This initiative echoed the Foundation's commitment to providing focused, tailored support to CSOs own utilisation of technology and innovative digital tools and provided approaches to enhance their sustainability and impact.

This funding continues to serve a critical area of need for CSOs in the Levant region. Working in collaboration with an expert technical partner, the Foundation will continue to refine and develop this support programme moving forward.

Tabadol Programme 2023: Innovating Sustainable Models

Through the Tabadol programme, the Asfari Foundation supported 10 social entrepreneurs and provided grants to 10 civil society organisations to collaborate on nurturing social entrepreneurs and enhancing the innovative capacities of CSOs. The programme serves as a bridge between the two to exchange ideas, work together, and develop sustainable solutions.

Tabadol provides a platform for emerging changemakers to connect with established entities, fostering a dynamic exchange of knowledge and expertise. Through Tabadol, the Asfari Foundation aims to support individuals and organisations, to create sustainable change within the communities and regions they serve.

Brussels VII Conference on Supporting the Future of Syria: Global Engagement in Refugee Education

The Foundation supported the holding of an event at the Brussels Conference in June 2023, led by <u>Jusoor</u> who shared research findings and insights into the educational needs of Syrian refugee children in Lebanon and emphasised the need for 21st century skills to be incorporated within education programming.

The event advocated for finding innovative and alternative solutions that guarantee access to quality education and livelihood opportunities for refugees.

War on Gaza Response

In the early days after the war on Gaza started, the Asfari Foundation in partnership with <u>Arab Foundation Forum</u> actively supported a coalition of committed actors to direct vital funds to grassroots organisations, addressing the urgent humanitarian needs in the region.

This <u>call to action</u> was spearheaded by <u>Taawon (Welfare Association)</u>, the <u>United Palestinian Appeal</u>, and the <u>American Friends Service Committee</u>, all of which are locally-led organisations run by and with Palestinians and who have an extensive network of partners currently in Gaza. The partner agencies have immediate access to funds and accounts, which enabled them to make urgent interventions to support the needs of Gaza's population under attack.

The Foundation was nominated for this recognition by one of its partners, <u>Yes Theatre</u>, a Palestinian civil society organisation working in Hebron. The nomination and the award highlighted the Foundation's distinguished entrepreneurship program in addressing social issues facing local communities, and emphasising the unique partnership approach the Foundation has established with its partners in the region.
